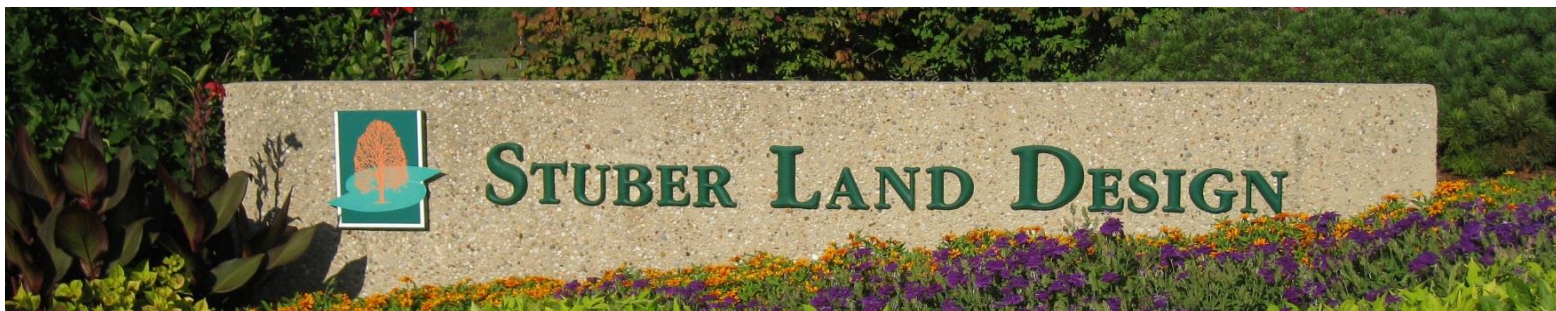

Summer Plant Care

Many insects are out early and in full force. Japanese Beetles, Rose Sawflies, and Boxwood Psyllid to name a few. Keep a bottle of Insect Control RTU (with Pyrethrins) or Sevin to spray for these.

There are a lot of damaged/dead/stressed plants from this past winter season. Some trees, as well, are showing signs of stress from the drought about 4 years ago.
